A free kick from the right side of the box to the back post was lashed in by Lewis Coburn after bouncing off a couple of players. The Whitworth team immediately ran to the referee claiming handball, but the referee then disallowed the goal for a push!

Still All Saints came forward and again should have doubled their advantage as another good cross from the right to the back post to Abdul Kassama would have led to a second goal. However the ball hit a bobble, the striker hit it and sent it wide. Two let-offs in the space of 10 minutes spurred Whitworth on and they rallied. The home team scored back to back goals in the space of 5 minutes, despite claims from All Saints that the second goal was off-side.
