Dear Parents

As I write this newsletter, I would like to thank both yourselves and your children for the resilience and determination which you have all shown over the last 18 months. In spite of unprecedented events, it is still a wonderful job to be the headteacher of our school, and this is due to the support and understanding of all of you, for which I am always appreciative.

**Meet the Teacher Morning** - we have taken the difficult decision to cancel this morning, where traditionally, children spend a morning with their new teacher for September. Children will have the opportunity to say hello to their new teacher before the end of term. This will be done at a safe distance, in order to preserve the bubble groups!

**Mrs Warran** – Our Year 3 teacher, Mrs Warran, will be leaving St. Peter's at the end of this term. We wish her well as she moves on to pastures new.

**Be Seen in Green or Blue Day** – due to bubble closures, the children have not had the opportunity to purchase the small items in aid of the Royal Manchester Children's Hospital. We will be selling these in school on Monday, 12<sup>th</sup> July. Please send your child in with up to £1 if you would like them to purchase an item. Items include pencils, rubbers, and fluffy bugs!

**Year 6 Science** – on Tuesday, 13<sup>th</sup> July, Year 6 will be taking part in a science curriculum lesson where they will be learning about the physical effects on the body of cigarettes, alcohol, and drugs.

**Archery** - Year 6 have the opportunity to take part in an archery after school club. Please complete the tear-off slip from last week's newsletter, or from the paper letter sent out by Mrs Barber.

**Reports** - the usual end of year reports will be sent out to parents on Monday, 12<sup>th</sup> July. There is a parent drop-in on Tuesday, 13<sup>th</sup> July for parents who may have particular questions following the reading of their child's report. This drop-in will take place in the classrooms as usual, but please note that procedures will be in place to minimise the transmission of Covid.

**Hairstyles** – Please could I ask parents to ensure that children do not return to school in September with hairstyles that do not meet our policy. Please see below – changes have been highlighted.

**Please note that children should not have extreme or bizarre hairstyles for school. To try and clarify a potentially subjective judgement for parents the following would deem to be unacceptable: shaved sides, shaved all over, tramlines, hair art, dyed hair, hair extensions, hair pieces and hair gel. This also includes incorporated shapes. In other words, hair should be a similar length all over, avoiding extreme differences of length of hair. Should school deem any hair style unacceptable then staff will speak to parents of younger children and ask them to amend hair style if possible and avoid this in the future. Staff will talk to older children first and then inform parents. If parents are unwilling to adhere to school policy, then children will be taught in isolation until the issue is resolved.**

**Coronavirus** - If you receive a positive test for your child in the evening, over a weekend or during a school holiday, please e-mail: [covid@st-peters.tameside.sch.uk](mailto:covid@st-peters.tameside.sch.uk) to let us know as soon as possible. This enables us to take any necessary action following a positive test as soon as possible (especially if this involves the closure of a bubble in school). If you or your child have symptoms, you MUST book a PCR test online, or by calling 111. The lateral flow tests, which can be collected from pharmacies/ testing sites and carried out at home, are NOT sufficient. A PCR test is necessary should you have a cough, temperature or loss of taste or smell. This applies even if you have carried out a lateral flow test, and it is negative

**New Nursery and Reception starters September 2021** - letters have been sent out confirming the September start date. Throughout the summer holidays please would you check your e-mails, as due to the pandemic situation we may need to contact you to change dates, if Government advice guides us to do so.

**Nursery Wraparound Provision** - from September we are pleased to offer wraparound care in our nursery unit. The sessions are from 11:55 am until 15:15. The charge is £10.00 per afternoon session.

**Nursery Snack Fund/School Fund** – please would you bring any outstanding payments up to date. Nursery snack fund for this term is £24.50 payable to St Peter's Catholic Primary School alternatively, you can use the School Money on-line system [www.eduspot.co.uk](http://www.eduspot.co.uk) Snack fund is £2.50 per week. We also ask for £1.00 a week as a voluntary contribution for curriculum enhancement as explained in the Nursery Prospectus and is available to view on the website under the Admissions section.

**School Dinner Money** – please would you bring any outstanding payments up to date. Please ensure that money is placed in an envelope clearly marked with the pupil's name and class and handed to their class teacher, alternatively you can pay through the Tameside website [www.tameside.gov.uk](http://www.tameside.gov.uk) school & education > school meals.

**We will not be able to issue a school dinner to any child where there is a debt of more than £20.00. In such cases parents will be expected to provide their child with a packed lunch.**

If your circumstances change you may be eligible to apply for free school meals. More information is available on the school website under school meals where there is a link to a website [www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/sims-tameside](http://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/sims-tameside) where you can complete an online application to see if you are eligible. If it is undecided, then proof of benefits will be required to be shown at school.

**Please note there is a slight school meal increase to £2.40 per day from the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2021.**

**Year 6 dinner money** - please check with school office before making any payments in advance as any overpayments at the end of the academic year cannot be refunded.

From September 2021 any pupils moving up to year 3 will **not be** entitled to the Universal Free School Meals therefore any meals taken will have to be paid for. Please see above with ways regarding making payment. If you wish your child to change to a packed lunch, please would you let the office know no later than Friday 16<sup>th</sup> July.

### **Year 3 transition**

**Current Year 2** – from September your child will require a school tie to go with the junior uniform. Ties are available from the school office priced £3.00 each or can be purchased online from our suppliers.
