World Mental Health Day

<u>Transfer from Primary to Secondary School – September 2025</u> - As our Year 6 children are due to transfer to high school in September, an application should be made using the online application form via the Citizens Portal, which is available on the 'School Admissions' pages on Tameside's website https://www.tameside.gov.uk/schools/admissions under the section 'Secondary School Admission' you are advised to read the 'Moving On' booklet before you complete your online form. The closing date for application forms is Thursday 31st October 2024.

<u>Open Mornings</u> – These will be held on 15 November and 9 January, both at 9.30am. They are for families interested in applying for a place in our Nursery or Reception classes. Families are invited to look around our school and to ask any questions that they may have. If you know of families who may be in the position of looking for a school place, please feel free to share these dates with them. Places can be booked by telephoning Mrs Murray in our school office.

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Movement Breaks – These take place throughout the day at St. Peter's. Class teachers know their children well, and they have identified particular children in their class who may benefit from joining with friends for a ten-minute 'movement break' at specific times during the day. Our teaching assistants lead movement breaks for reasons such as 'wake and shake,' re-focussing or decompressing at the end of the day.

We ask that one adult stays with each Nursery child for the disco, but we ask families of all other year groups to leave their children with us to be supervised by school staff.

<u>Walking to school</u> – We have received a concern from a family who are worried about the need to walk in Hough Hill Road in the mornings due to the pavement outside the British Protection pub being blocked with families chatting, and with prams. We are quite sure that nothing has bene done purposefully or deliberately, but we kindly ask that this pavement is kept clear for people to access as they walk to school.

Access to School – Please always let us know if you need us to make any adaptations so that you can access our school site. For example, we are aware that the security gate may not be easy to open for people who are wheelchair users, or for people with joint or muscle difficulties. However, the security gate must be in place for the safeguarding of our children, and staff would be more than happy to come out to the gate to open it for visitors in this situation. Another example is sports day. If access via our school field gate is difficult, please just let us know, and we will arrange for you to access the field via another route. Adult-sized chairs with arms are always available for anybody visiting to watch an assembly or a play, and we are happy to reserve spaces in the hall for wheelchair users. We hope that all of our families and visitors would feel comfortable discussing any access requirements with us.

<u>Nursery Snack Fund</u> - snack fund is £2.50 per week. We also ask for £1.00 a week as a voluntary contribution for curriculum enhancement. Payments are made via School Money Scheme. Nursery snack fund for this half term will be £27.30. Snack fund amounts will vary due to staggered intake.

<u>Nursery Wraparound Provision</u> – we are pleased to offer wraparound care in our nursery unit. The sessions are from 11:55 am until 15:15. The charge is £15.00 per each afternoon session. Please speak with Mrs Walker or Miss O'Brien to arrange any additional afternoons.

<u>School Meals</u> - The amount due for KS2 (juniors) for this half term is £124.80 (39 meals). Payments are made through the Tameside website - https://www.tameside.gov.uk/schoolmeals. Please could you ensure all payments are up to date. The TMBC website is now up and running. Sorry for any inconvenience this has caused.

If your circumstances change you may be eligible to apply for free school meals. More information is available on the school website under school meals where there is a link to a website www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/sims-tameside Here, you can complete an online application to see if you are eligible.

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Also, if you think you may be eligible and you have a child in the infants - including Nursery, although Infant children are entitled to a free school meal under the universal free school meal scheme, you should still apply for this, as school receives extra funding to support your child in school. Please contact Mrs Murray in the school office for more information.
