The sacrament of First Forgiveness for Year 3 children will take place on Thursday 20 March at 6:00pm in St. Peter's Church. A prayer sponsor has a very simple, yet lovely and incredibly vital role. We simply ask our sponsors to pray for our children. You would be most welcome to attend our prayer sponsors' party on Monday, 10 February, as well as the sacraments of First Forgiveness and First Holy Communion, but there is no obligation to do so at all. Parents of children in year groups 4, 5 and 6 who would like their children to be part of the sacramental programme this academic year should speak to the school office or to Miss Cooper at their earliest opportunity. Unfortunately, we are unable to authorise time away from school during term time unless the circumstances are exceptional.
<u>SEND</u> <u>Friends</u>	Family members of children on our SEND register are most welcome to attend a coffee morning in the mobile classroom on Wednesday, 15 January from 9.00am. Mrs Russell, our SENDCO, will lead the session, and at the next session, our educational psychologist will be attending. Do feel free to come along and join us – everyone is assured of a warm welcome.
Opportunity with the Halle Choir	Parents of boys in year groups 3, 4, 5 and 6 – we invite you to express interest if your sons would like to attend a workshop with the directors of the Halle Youth Choirs. The workshop takes place during the school day on 13 March. It is entitled 'Boys Sing!' and has a cost of £7.75. At the moment our school is simply gathering a register of interest from our junior-aged boys. If we have sufficient interest, we will look into hiring or arranging transport to the venue at Halle St. Peter's in Ancoats. <u>NSPCC</u>	The NSPCC will be visiting children in Year 2, Year 5 and Year 6 on Wednesday, 15 January. You may recall a virtual assembly that we held with all children in the Autumn term. (The letter that we sent to families to accompany the assembly has been sent along with this newsletter). Wednesday's visits will serve as an in-person recap of this vital message of safety for our children.
Care when dropping and collecting children at school	We have received a concern from one of our neighbours that families arriving at our school around the times of 8.50am and 3.20pm are blocking their driveway when they park. Obviously, this is causing difficulties to our neighbour in terms of access and egress from their home. More concerningly, however, the neighbour has reported the use of language by some of our families towards them as making them feel quite unsettled. We ask, please, that our families using cars to drop and collect children at school do so considerately, and with the safety and wellbeing of our children at the forefront of their minds. School has once again requested the presence of a PCSO to assist in facilitating this.

<u>Christmas Show - USB Orders</u> – If you would like to order a USB of your child Christmas show, please send your order form into school in clearly marked envelope with your child's name and correct money. Please note - no change can be given due to a third party dealing with the cash. The deadline for orders is **10:00am Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> January** for all productions.

<u>Admission to school September 2025</u> – letters have been emailed to families regarding the admission to St Peter's. If your child is registered at our school and you have not received a copy of the application process, then contact the school office. Closing date for online applications is **15<sup>th</sup> January 2025.** Please note that school requires a copy of birth and baptism certificates, along with two proofs of residency. **Even if proof of residency was submitted for a Nursery application a further 2 proof of residency is required for the 2025 admission process.** More detailed information is available on the school website under the School Admissions section.

<u>Admission to Nursery 2025</u> – letters have been emailed regarding the admission intake process for September. Proofs of residency and birth and baptismal certificates if applicable are required. 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### **Community Information**

#### **NHS Pharmacy First Service**

This service enables children and adults to get convenient access to healthcare advice and treatment (where appropriate) for seven common conditions without the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment. Accessing the service may hopefully mean that children and parents are helped to feel better as quickly as possible.

There is no need to make an appointment; parents or carers can pop into their local Boots pharmacy with their child and ask for help under the service.

Support for the following conditions can be accessed under the service, free of charge (unless NHS prescription charges apply):

Common Condition	Patient Eligibility
Earache	1 to 17 years
Impetigo	1 year and over
Infected insect bites and stings	1 year and over
Sore throat	5 years and over
Sinusitis	12 years and over
Uncomplicated urinary tract infection	Women aged 16 to 64 years
Shingles	18 years and over
