

<u>Arbor</u> - We are excited to inform you that we now have a new communications portal – ARBOR. Over the next week a letter will be sent out with a how to guide on downloading the ARBOR app to your smart phone. Please contact school if your email address has changed, as a link will be sent out to current email addresses we have on our system.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Parent App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way – i.e. – in-app messages / emails.

<u>PE Kit</u> – over the past few weeks there has been numerous children forgetting their PE kit, **please ensure that you child has their full PE kit in school**. If you have any unwanted PE kits at home, we would be grateful of your donation. Details of the PE uniform can be found on the 'Uniform' page under the 'Parent Information' tab on our school website. Please ensure junior children have their full outdoor kit – navy or black sweater and navy or black tracksuit/ jogging bottoms. This is because of the weather becoming colder as we go into the season of Winter. Thank you.

<u>Nursery Snack Fund</u> - snack fund is £2.50 per week. We also ask for £1.00 a week as a voluntary contribution for curriculum enhancement. Payments are made via School Money. Nursery snack fund for this half term is £20.30.

<u>Nursery Wraparound Provision</u> – we are pleased to offer wraparound care in our nursery unit. The sessions are from 11:55 am until 15:15. The charge is £15.00 per each afternoon session. Please speak with Mrs Walker or Miss O'Brien to arrange any additional afternoons.

<u>school Meals</u> - The amount due for KS2 (juniors) for this half term is £92.80 (29 meals). Payments for school meals will be made via School Money - <u>www.edsp.co/sm-login</u>. Please could you ensure ALL payments are cleared and up to date. If your circumstances change you may be eligible to apply for free school meals. <u>Packed Lunches</u> - If your child no longer requires school meals and wishes to go onto packed lunches, we require a minimum of **2 week notice period.** All requests need to be made in writing to the school meal email address - <u>schoolmeals@st-peters.tameside.sch.uk</u>

<u>Coconut, Prawns, Avocado, Nut and Sesame allergies</u> - please could I ask parents not to include any of these items in their child's packed lunch as we have children in school with severe allergies. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.
