


# St. Peter's Catholic Primary School

#### Bridges: Break the Cycle

We have been asked to share the following information from the 'Bridges' service in the local area of Tameside:

Break the Cycle - Support for people who show harmful behaviours in relationships

People who show harmful behaviours in their relationships are being urged to get help in a new campaign aimed at reducing domestic abuse and supporting families.

In 2023/24 there were 3692 domestic abuse suspects from Tameside reported to Greater Manchester Police – of these 673 were repeat suspects.

Tameside Council is working with partners and Talk Listen Change (TLC) to provide free support to help people to break the cycle of harmful behaviours and help build safer, stronger and happier home environments where everyone will benefit including any children they have.

There are bespoke programmes tailored for different needs including people in same sex relationships, women who use harm and people where English is not their first language. Partners, family members and children will also be offered support whilst the person is accessing TLC support. The programme has successfully reduced physical and emotionally abusive behaviours in most people who have completed it.
