

Children in Reception to Year 2 receive Universal Free School Meals, so no payment is required. For Years 3 to 6 packed lunch pupils, the cost is £3.20, payable via Arbor.

Robinwood Residential Instalment Reminder - A letter was sent out on 11th July regarding the Robinwood Residential trip taking place on 29th April 2026. If you have opted to pay in instalments, please continue to follow the guidance outlined in the

letter. The next instalment was due 10th October and should be paid via Arbor through the Trips section on your child's account. Please note that all payments must be settled in full by 27th February 2026. Thank you for your continued support in helping us provide this exciting opportunity for our pupils.



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#### Nasal Flu Vaccination - Reception to Year 6

The Department of Health has confirmed that all children from Year R to Year 6 will be offered a nasal flu vaccination annually. This year, the immunisations will take place at school on Monday, 17 November. To give consent, please check your email for the econsent form, which was sent on Wednesday, 15 October. If you haven't received it, please contact the school office.

NHS Guidance on keeping children well this winter - Tameside Public Health have produced the attached leaflet with advice to help keep children well this winter. This includes information about ways to reduce the chance of catching and passing on infections, some of the more common winter illnesses and how to manage them, as well as information on vaccinations. <u>Nursery Snack Fund via Arbor</u> - We'd like to let you know that the Nursery Snack Fund is now available to purchase via the School Shop on Arbor. This is a one-time payment that covers snacks and curriculum enhancements for our Nursery children up until **24th October**. Going forward, payments will be added to Arbor **half-termly**, with the amount varying depending on the number of school days in each half term. Thank you for your continued support in helping us provide enriching experiences and healthy snacks for our Nursery children.



<u>School Meal Payments Now on Arbor</u> - We'd like to inform parents of pupils who pay for school meals that **all payments are now made via Arbor**. This change will help streamline the payment process and make it easier for families to manage school-related costs in one place. Please log in to your Arbor account to view and make payments for school meals. If you have any questions or need support accessing Arbor, feel free to contact the school office.

If your circumstances change you may be eligible to apply for free school meals. More information is available on the school website under school meals where there is a link to a website <a href="www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/sims-tameside">www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/sims-tameside</a> Here, you can complete an online application to see if you are eligible.

Also, if you think you may be eligible and you have a child in the infants - including Nursery, although Infant children are entitled to a free school meal under the universal free school meal scheme, you should still apply for this, as school receives extra funding to support your child in school. Please contact Mrs Murray in the school office for more information.

<u>Please ensure cocktail sticks are not included in your child's packed lunch, as they can pose a safety risk.</u>

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

<u>Coconut, Prawns, Avocado and Nut allergies</u> - please could I ask parents not to include any of these items in their child's packed lunch as we have children in school with significant allergies. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

<u>Packed Lunches</u> - If your child would like to change from school meals to packed lunches, then please give us 2 weeks' notice at <u>schoolmeals@st-peters.tameside.sch.uk</u> More information about school meals may be found on our website

<u>School Fund</u> – We kindly invite families to contribute to our School Fund for the 2025-2026 academic year. The suggested donation is £38.00, and payments can be made conveniently online via the School Shop on the Arbor App. As this is a voluntary contribution, we are sincerely grateful for any support you are able to provide. All funds raised go directly towards wider curriculum opportunities for the children, enriching their learning experiences beyond the classroom. Thank you for your continued support.

<u>Arbor</u> - Please download the new free Arbor parent app onto to your smart phone where you will be kept up to date with all correspondence from school. The in-app messaging will replace the text messaging service that school used in the past. If additional parents would like their email address adding to their child's information to access Arbor, please contact the school office. We currently have 89% of parents/carers using the app and keeping up to date with information!
