Learning that has taken place this half term

Creation and Covenant



Children in **Nursery** have been learning about God's wonderful world. They are beginning to understand that God loves each one of us always.

Reception have been learning that God created our beautiful world and each of us, and how we can care for and love ourselves, our families, others, and God's creation.



In Year 1, the children have been using the Creation story in Genesis 1 to look at the importance how they can take care of God's world.

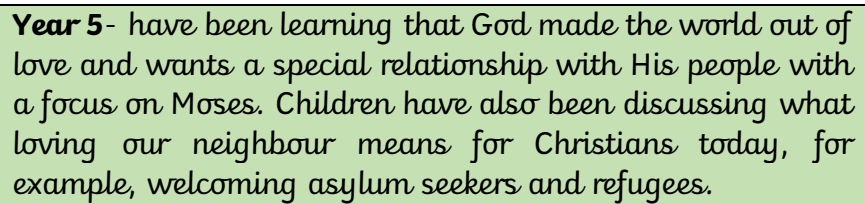
